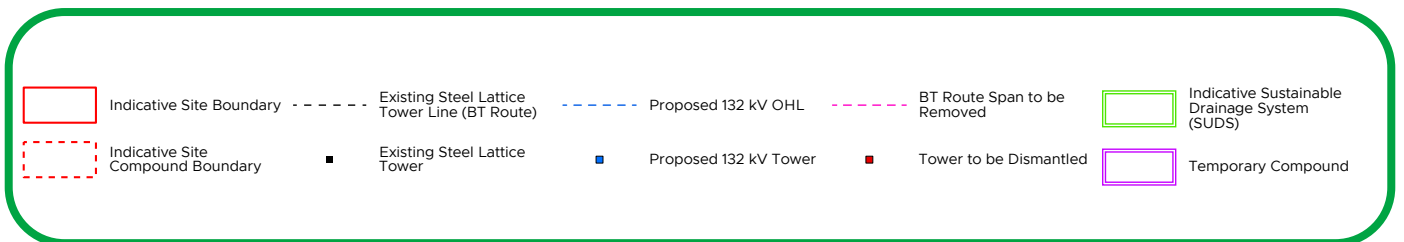
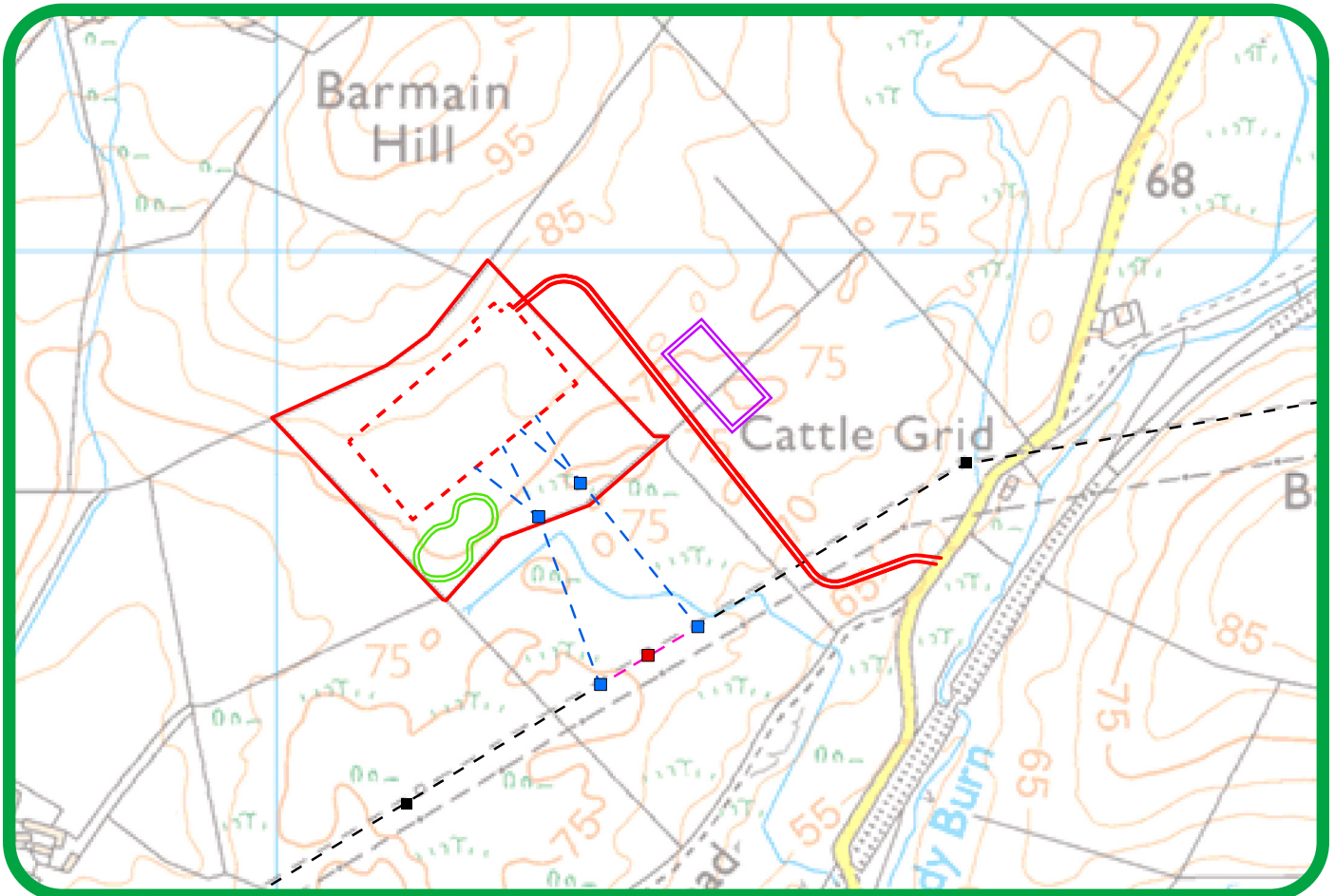


# What is Proposed

SP Transmission is proposing three new steel lattice towers and a replacement tower to tie into the existing steel lattice tower line that runs northeast to Glenluce Substation. This is required to connect the proposed Ladyburn 132 kV Collector Substation to the electricity network.



## The Proposed Substation

Following careful environmental planning, the site shown above has been selected to minimise potential effects on people and the environment.

We are now seeking your views. Involving local communities is very important to us, as it helps identify any issues and address concerns at an early stage. More information on the project and the proposed site is available on the project website, which also explains how you can provide your feedback.

# What is Proposed

A copy of this information leaflet is being sent to all landowners within approximately 1 km of the preferred substation site. The consultation is also being advertised in local newspapers, and a printed poster explaining the project and consultation will be displayed on public notice boards.

We invite you to visit the project website (address below) for more information, including the Siting and Consultation Document, which outlines the initial stages of work to identify a proposed site for the new substation. The Siting and Consultation Document includes a review of key environmental features, identification of alternative sites, and analysis of site options.
