


# Euchanhead overhead line proposal

SP Energy Networks (SPEN) has been contracted to provide a grid connection for the proposed Euchanhead Wind Farm near Sanquhar, Dumfries and Galloway. SPEN has a legal duty under the Electricity Act 1989 to provide grid connections to new electricity-generating developments.

We are now undertaking a consultation as part of the engineering and environmental review of the potential route options. A preferred route has been identified (see map overleaf) and the route-selection process is documented in a Routeing Consultation available to download from our website [http://www.spenergynetworks.co.uk/pages/euchanhead\\_windfarm\\_grid\\_connection.aspx](http://www.spenergynetworks.co.uk/pages/euchanhead_windfarm_grid_connection.aspx) from 09:00 on **22 November 2021** to 17:00 on **17 December 2021**.

The proposal is for a 132 kV trident wood pole overhead line using H poles 13–18 m in height with spans of 70–110 m. You can obtain further information on the proposed design from our website.
