	growing area in terms of Gross Value Added outside London. Manufacturing is central to local economy, including large energy intensive industries, such as petro chemicals and car manufacturing.	

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Summarised significant growth plans, including plans for between 75,000 and 100,000 new homes over next 20 years and HS2 links by the end of the decade. The LEP's area also includes a science corridor and enterprise zone.

Discussion	CT presented on SPEN approach to innovation and discussed success of innovation funding in RIIO-1, across Distribution and Transmission. CT provided examples of innovation projects that had been started in previous price controls and had been built upon. SPEN has strong innovation pipeline that progresses projects from inception to BAU.	
	CT covered Active Network Management (ANM) as a key area SPEN is looking to standardise and implement across the board, touching on cyber security as being of fundamental importance to DNOs when looking at solutions like ANM, automation and monitoring. Discussed wider benefits delivered through ANM to parties connected to the network or to the wider economy. For example, allows generators to connect earlier than they would otherwise be able to.	
	CT covered SPEN's 'Year of Innovation' two years ago and development of interactive iHub platform - internally sponsored campaigns to seek ideas and solutions for specific challenges.	
	CT summarised two high-level themes for RIIO-ED2 – energy system transition and consumer vulnerability. These are aligned to regulators view and what the company has been delivering in RIIO-ED1. SPEN will develop its thinking on these with stakeholders through the engagement programme.
