8. RESTORATION OF MOTIVE POWER

When there is a requirement to restore motive power to carry out work or testing an **Approved** written procedure shall determine the manner in which work or testing shall be carried out.

Any such procedure shall form part of these Management Safety Procedures within this section, having a sequential OPSAF-11-xxx number and denoted MSP 3.3.xx.
